GOOD OLD ROCK AND ROLL RETURNS TO HORSHAM

Wimmera Health Care Group's new rock band All Stitched Up will perform a Christmas Gig next Friday night.

The band is made up of Wimmera Health Care Group staff members.

Mr Enright said that local artist David McMaster would support the band and that funds raised will support the Wimmera Health Care Group Foundation.

Peter Daffy, a prominent Wimmera musician in his own right, said that he was looking forward to playing at the Christmas Gig. "Once again, we're hoping for a full house. We just want people to come along, enjoy our music and have a good time" he said.
